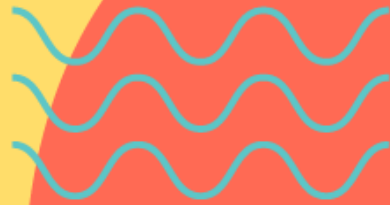

Subject-Verb Agreement (SVA)
Subjects and verbs in a sentence must agree in terms of plurality. For example, singular subjects require singular verbs.
* Decide what the subject of the sentence is and if it's singular or plural
* Most singular verbs end with 's'
* Uncountable nouns remain the same: *sheep, staff, luggage*
Example: ...it wouldn't be as easy as it ~~seems~~ *seem* (2019 O Level)

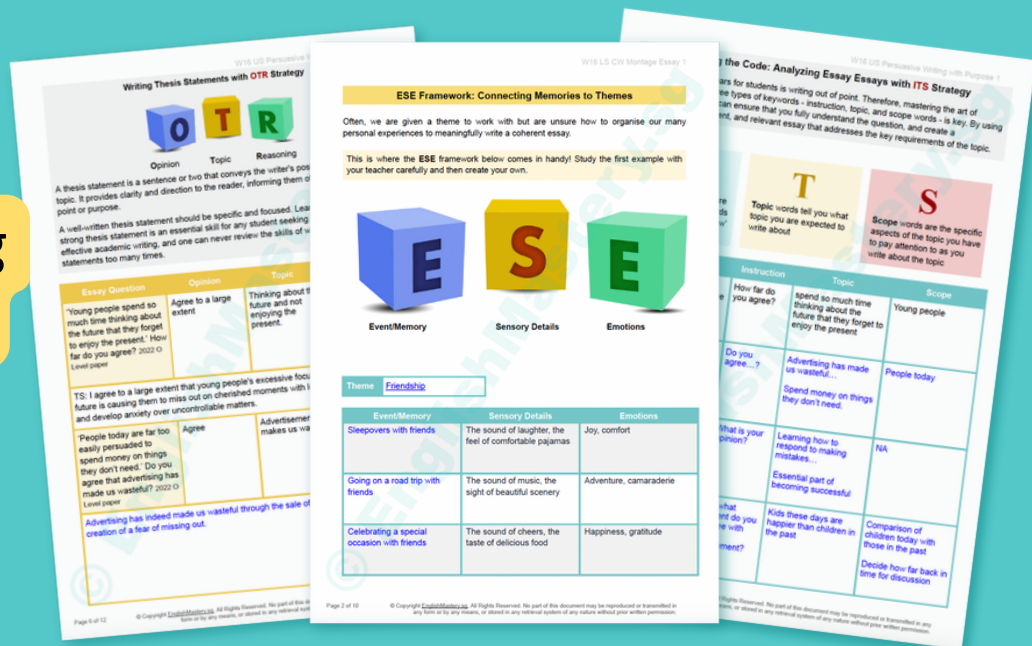
Quantity
1 **Nouns** Nouns and their determiners need to reflect the same quantity
Example: My whole trip was ~~an~~ *extraordinary* ~~experience~~ *experiences*. (2020 O Level)
2 **Articles** Words that tell us whether a noun is specific or general, such as *a, an, the*
Example: The bridge can carry 800 people ~~at the~~ *at* time. (2020 O Level)
3 **Quantifiers** Words that indicate the quantity of nouns, such as *some, many, all*
Example: Although many people know these facts, ~~few~~ *less* people know about Sir Stamford's other unusual interests. (2014 O Level)

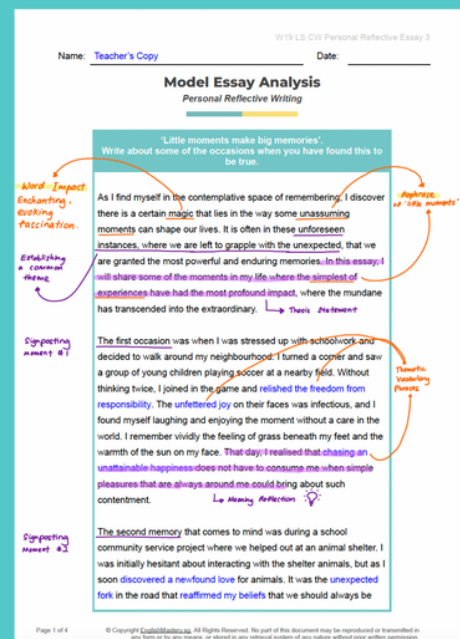
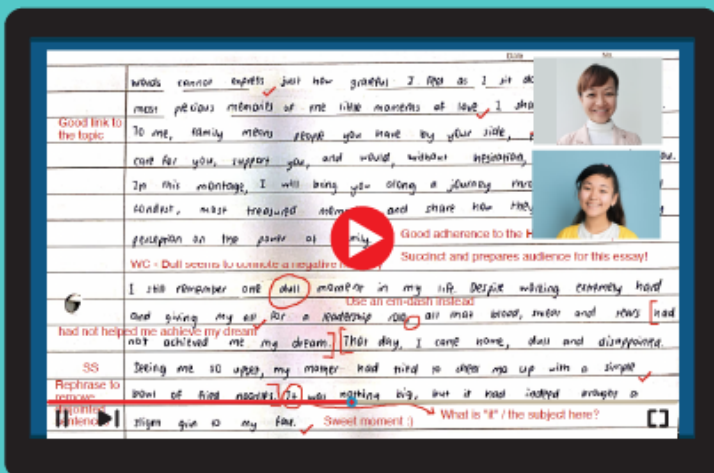

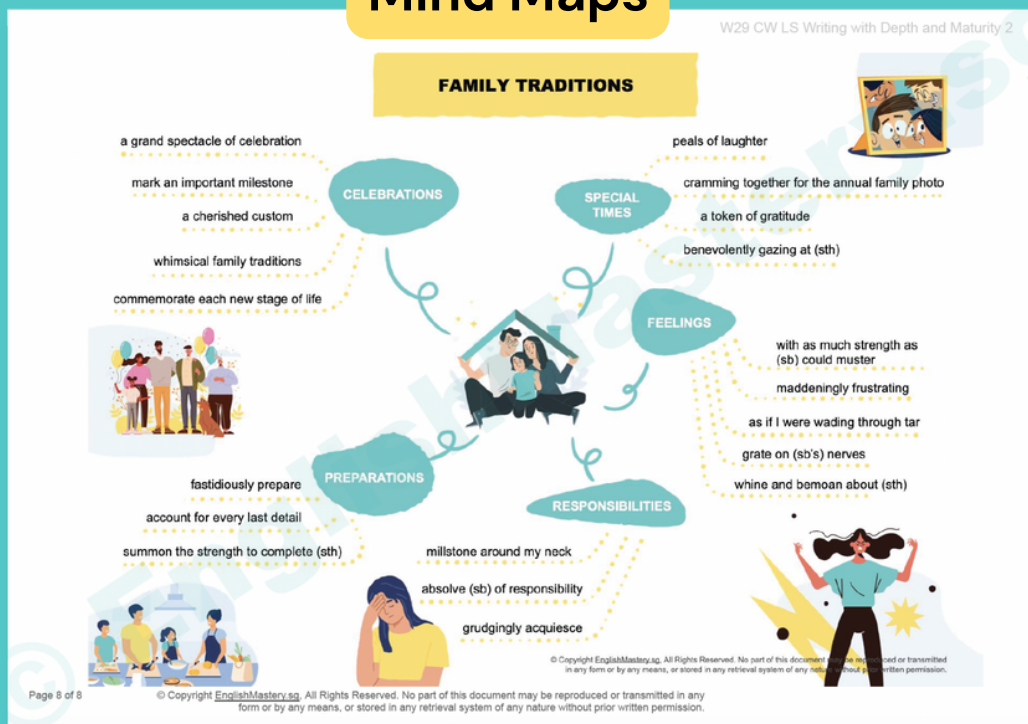
